
TOWARDS THE TRUTH

DEDICATION AND DETERMINATION: THE BOY WHO RAN



I was tired and exhausted but my mind was strong. This never say die attitude of my mind gave me just enough strength to complete the exams in around 2 Hours and 15 Minutes. My planning and preparation came to my aid. When I think back to that day, it was not just my performance and studies, there was a much more important and crucial lesson of life that I learnt from that experience. Never Give up. We brought the philosophy of knowledge sharing and hard-work to Doha Bank to achieve its goals. Even today, I make a point to spend 10-12 hours a day for the organization. I knew that bringing the kerosene was essential for my family and once again my mind cemented my determination to brave adverse odds. So, I bought 2 tins of kerosene and walked back home. It took me around 3.5 hours. It was nothing but love and compassion for my family which gave me strength to walk back home. I was not even able to sit properly for dinner later and my hands were full of blisters. My hands were burning but my heart was happy with the satisfaction of fulfilling my word to my mother. Compassion begins at home by understanding the sufferings of family members. When we share their suffering and try to help them it brings positive energy in the family.

This trait of compassion evidenced in the past has aided me to recognize the feelings of people I work with in the industry. Even now, I do try and keep my word with integrity and honesty in whatever I do. In Doha Bank as a practice we develop the compassion of respecting and treating employees as part of a family.
